

A Grievance is a dispute of one or more employees involving the application or interpretation of a statute, regulation, policy or practice which falls under the jurisdiction of the departments.

ACSS members are entitled to advice and counsel appropriate to the processing of a grievance or appeal by an ACSS Labor Relations Representative (LRR).
